In Woolton Primary we teach a curriculum that enables our pupils to become successful users of language and demonstrate an understanding of different cultures around the world. Children in Woolton Primary learn Spanish from Years 1 to 6. In England learning a foreign language is statutory from KS2. Therefore, children in Years 1-3 have the same objectives, and we build on their knowledge and understanding each year through half hour sessions, as the programme of study is written for KS2.

Through the teaching of Spanish at Woolton Primary, we aim to teach the pupils to:

- Listen attentively to the spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Explore the patterns and sounds of the language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words
- Engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and responds to those of others
- Speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures
- Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases.
- Present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences
- Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language
- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing
- Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including using a dictionary
- Write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly
- Describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing
- Understand the basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including: feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high frequency verbs; key features and patterns of the language and how to apply these.
