## PE and School Sport Funding

The government is determined to secure a significant and lasting legacy from the very successful 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games that were held in London. In order to achieve this and improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools, additional funding has been made available.

At Woolton Primary School we believe that sport plays a crucial role contributing to the health and well-being of our children. We also believe that Sporting excellence and participation go hand in hand with academic standards.

We have used the Sport Funding to purchase membership of the Liverpool Schools Sports Partnership, which alongside our own school actions has enabled us to strengthen and improve our provision in the following ways:

- To hire a specialist PE sports coach to teach PE and work alongside our teachers when teaching PE
- To support and engage the least active children through new/additional sports and health clubs
- To pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- To provide cover to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- To attend sport competitions and increase pupils' participation in school Games
- To buy quality assured professional development modules /materials for PE and sport
- To provide places for pupils in after school sports clubs and holiday clubs

## PE Curriculum

A wide range of activities are delivered in school which aim to engage and inspire all children. We are also committed to ensure that all children receive high quality well-planned PE lessons and opportunities.

Over the year each child will participate in games, athletics, dance and gymnastics lessons. Opportunities are also planned for swimming in Years 2/3/4/5/6 and Outdoor and Adventurous activities in Years 5/6. Our aim is that all children leave our school at the end of Year 6 able to swim 25 metres.

## The Wider Curriculum

PE and sport has a high profile in our school and permeates many aspects of school life.

Throughout the year we hold themed activities for example WPS Sports Week June 2021 when children participated in a wide range of activities and enjoyed sessions in new sports activities. We also offer extra opportunities for sporting activities as rewards for 100% attendance and behaviour incentives.

During our residential visits, children are given opportunity to participate in many different activities which may include orienteering and assault courses.

Other agencies are used to enhance the variety of activities available and we take full advantage when these opportunities become available. For example Everton and



Liverpool football clubs run training sessions in school. Talented children are signposted to local clubs and events to encourage them to develop their skills.

School also believes it is important for the children to meet local sporting role models. Visitors have included a local Olympian.

### Beyond the School Day

The school is keen to provide a wide range of extra-curricular clubs for children throughout the year which are organised by our teaching staff and/or sports coaches.

Children enjoy the opportunity to work with different teachers and have the chance to try many sports such as Tennis, Football, Multi-skills, Hockey, Cricket, Rounders, Athletics and Cross Country.

We try to cater for all our children's needs and so ask the children which clubs they would like to see included during the year; we also monitor participation and check uptake against gender and free school meals.

We enter a wide range of competitions.

### Commitment

WPS is committed to providing an increasing range of opportunities for children to participate in high quality sports games and PE activities.

How we will we make sure the improvements are sustainable.

Improved participation and attainment in PE and sports will be sustained through regular monitoring by SLT members.

Provision will be reviewed on a termly basis.

Participation levels will be measured annually and any fall identified and addressed.

Provision will be monitored for quality and breadth regularly, with reports to governors made at each curriculum committee meeting.

A range of staff will be trained to ensure continuity and breadth of provision.
