Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others, as well as what support is available to them.

Work will be covered in classes focusing on this theme and Y5 will take part in a special drama production focussing on Online safety.


Mental Health Awareness Week
